Introduction

Our on-campus and distance-learning programmes in Hunter-Gatherer Archaeology and Anthropology are for students interested in the fascinating and remarkable world of hunter-gatherers. It is often claimed that humans have spent 90-99% of our existence as hunter-gatherers. Understanding these ways of life provides vital perspectives on human identity and the challenges and opportunities societies face today. Archaeology is the only discipline that can provide this information.

Our programmes introduce students to key themes in the archaeology of past hunter gatherers, the relationship between past and present hunting and gathering communities, and the contemporary context of knowledge production about hunter-gatherers. Our primary focus is the archaeology of *Homo sapiens* hunter-gatherers: we will include some discussion of non-*Homo sapiens*, but this is not a course on human evolution.

Students in the Masters and the Graduate

Diploma take the same taught courses for 60 credits in Autumn and Spring Trimesters, with the Masters having a 30 credits research dissertation in Summer Trimester.

The Graduate Certificate is a 30 credit, one year course, taught entirely online. Students take the same taught courses as the campus based students in Autumn and Spring and an Independent Research Project in Summer.

The GradCert is a recognised pathway for access to the MSc programme.

UCD Hunter-Gatherer Research Group

All students will be part of the Hunter-Gatherer Research Group, which includes book clubs, occasional seminars, social events, and opportunities for volunteering for field/lab work. Recent field projects have been in Ireland and Scotland. Students can work on materials from these projects for their dissertations.

Applicant Profile

- ◆ The MSc and GradDip programmes are intended for applicants with a degree in archaeology, anthropology, or cognate disciplines such as geography, history, environmental studies, or professionals working in museums, heritage management or related areas. Contact us for advice, especially to consider relevant archaeological experience.
- ◆ An upper second class honours degree, or international equivalent is required for entry to the MSc.
- ◆ The GradCert requires a lower second class honours degree in archaeology, anthropology, or other cognate disciplines. Alternatively, candidates may have equivalent professional/vocational experience (to be discussed with programme coordinator).
- ◆ Applicants whose first language is not English are also required to submit evidence of their English Language proficiency. It is expected that applicants will normally have reached on overall 7.0 in IELTS or equivalent.

- The heritage sector
- State sector bodies

- Education
