New Datasets

ISSDA is pleased to announce the following new datasets and updates are now available to request:

Irish Health Survey



The CSO recently deposited the Irish Health Survey with ISSDA.

The Irish Health Survey (IHS) was collected under Regulation (EC) No 1338/2008 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 16 December 2008 on Community statistics on public health and health and safety at work. This survey fulfils the need for public health policies to obtain reliable data on health status, health care usage and health determinants.

The survey is based on self-reported data from persons aged 15 years and over, and outlines their view of their health status – from how well they are feeling, to the extent to which they suffer from long-standing health conditions, as well as other factors.

ISSDA now holds the datasets for 2015 and 2019.

New wave of Healthy Ireland



The annual Healthy Ireland Survey provides an up-to-date picture of the nation's health along with a robust and credible baseline set of data on a range of health behaviours which have significant impact on individual health

outcomes.

The Survey reports on many lifestyle behaviours such as smoking, alcohol consumption, physical activity, active travel, weight management, diet and nutrition, health service utilization patterns, dental health, chronic disease incidence, mental health, sleep patterns, dementia awareness, caring responsibilities and sexual health.

This update includes data from 2019.

StudentSurvey.ie (Irish Survey of Student Engagement) 2022



The central aim of StudentSurvey.ie (Irish Survey of Student Engagement) is to develop a valuable source of information about students' experiences of higher education in Ireland. The results of the survey are intended primarily to add value at institutional level, and to inform national policy.

A detailed online survey was offered to first year undergraduates, final year undergraduates and postgraduate students on taught programmes. Data are presented as responses to individual items and as calculated scores for nine indicators that relate to broad aspects of student engagement, such as Collaborative Learning and Higher Order Learning. StudentSurvey.ie has formative links with the US National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) and the Australasian Survey of Student Engagement (AUSSE). Thus, Irish data can be evaluated in the context of other jurisdictions in addition to the national or sector contexts.
