Alternative Maths/Irish is Coded as level '3').</p> <p>In Senior Cert. and Matric, all subjects are Common Level (Code 6).</p> <p>In Junior Cert., Irish, English and Maths may be either Higher, Ordinary or Foundation Level (Codes 1, 2 or 3 respectively).
