

Graduate Diploma in Primary Care Nursing Practice

(One Year Blended Learning)



Introduction

The programme aims to provide formal education and training to equip nurses to work as expert generalists in Primary Care. Nurses working in Primary Care, General Practice and in the Public Health Nursing service will gain specialist theory in managing chronic illness and contemporary healthcare issues. Advanced Health Assessment skills will increase confidence and knowledge for practice.

Students are provided with a foundation in evidence-based practice, research and scholarly activity, and translating evidence into practice. The focused clinical practicum module allows for the application of specialist knowledge in the primary care setting. The modules will support Primary Care Nurses as leaders in delivering person-centred, planned and safe high-quality care.

Course Highlight

With an increased ageing population, an expected rise in multimorbidity and increased demand in health care, this programme supports Sláintecare's vision to enhance Primary Care Nurses' practice in shifting care delivery to the community.

Applicants must:

- Hold a minimum of a BSc Degree or equivalent in Nursing (or hold a suitable NFQ level 8 qualification). Applicants not holding a Bachelor's degree may apply for Accreditation of Prior Experiential Learning.
- Current registration as a Registered General Nurse with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Ireland
- Work 75 hours per month in the relevant setting
- Completed Professional Reference Form
- Declaration form signed by the relevant local Director of Public Health Nursing / GP in support of the applicant.
- A signed commitment from a nominated clinical supervisor / mentor

Fees and Funding

This programme is funded by Sláintecare Integration Innovation Fund Theme 4. Please note that all applicants are required to pay a €60 application fee. Your application cannot be processed fully unless the application fee has been paid.
