With 90-98 million native speakers, German is a very widely-spoken language in Europe. It is the first language of Germany and Austria and an official language in Switzerland and Liechtenstein. German speakers are very much in demand on the job market. German is actually a very logical language, and many words are quite similar to English. Studying German equips you with linguistic proficiency as well as cultural and analytical awareness – key requirements for many employers in today's world – and also gives you important transferable skills.

INTERNATIONAL STUDY OPPORTUNITIES

We strongly recommend that students avail of the opportunity to study for a year in Germany or Austria, gaining first-hand personal experience of interacting in a German-speaking environment, making many new contacts, and improving your academic performance. We have 10 partner universities from which to choose. The cost of living in Germany or Austria is far lower than in Dublin and the ERASMUS grant covers some of the costs.

The choice to study German at UCD (either as a complete beginner or as a non-beginner) offers many opportunities, both personal and professional.
